Dear Friend:

If you received this letter by fax, I may have been representing your interests since 2003 in a lawsuit called *A Fast Sign Company, Inc. v. American Home Services, Inc.* The case was certified as a class-action lawsuit concerning unsolicited fax advertisements. If you received this letter, the defendant sent an unsolicited advertisement to your fax number in 2002 or 2003 in violation of the Telephone Consumer Protection Act.

The case has settled and I am sending this letter to personally let you know that you are entitled to claim your share of the settlement if the fax number to which this fax was sent was your fax number between June 2002 and July 2003. **THIS IS NOT A SOLICITATION AND THERE IS NO CATCH. IF YOU ARE A MEMBER OF THE CLASS AND SUBMIT A VALID CLAIM FORM BY DECEMBER 24, 2014, AND THE COURT APPROVES THE SETTLEMENT, YOU WILL RECEIVE UP TO \$1,500.** The amount you will receive will depend on the number of timely and valid claims that class members file. If you received this letter at multiple fax numbers and those fax numbers were yours between June 2002 and July 2003, you are entitled to submit a claim for each fax number. If you do not submit a claim, you forfeit your right to a recovery.

To verify your membership in the class, go to www.ahsclassaction.com. Click on the link for the claim form and you will be taken to a page where you can enter your fax number. If your fax number is in the database, that makes you a member of the class and you will be able to access a claim form that you can submit to claim your share of the settlement.

If you are a member of the class and you have not already submitted a claim form, I urge you to do so by **December 24**. If you have any questions, you can get more information about the settlement at www.ahsclassaction.com or call **(844) 322-8241**.

P.S. — Some people have had questions about the need to supply your tax ID number to file a claim. If a payment exceeds \$600 to a class member, the payment is required to be reported to the IRS. If you don't provide your tax ID number, your payment may be subject to 28% backup withholding under federal law.
